Introduction

Te Māngai Pāho is committed to supporting the Māori media and music sectors and collectively improving the outcomes of the Maihi Karauna, the Crown's strategy for Māori language revitalisation.

Te Pūtake

Purpose

This funding opportunity supports reputable music organisations to host songwriting and collaboration initiatives that develop popular contemporary waiata reo Māori. Proposed collaborations should aim to grow the confidence and capability of New Zealanders to write reo Māori songs in popular genres. Focus should be on completing lyrics, song structures and melodies, and recording songs to studio demo level. Further, the expectation is that these demos will be later produced to release standard for release to the public before 31 December 2024.

This funding aligns with the Key Focus Area "Ngā Kaiwaihanga | Creators" articulated in Te Māngai Pāho's Standard Performance Expectations 2023/24.

Te Kaupapa Matua

Request for Proposals

This RFP invites music organisations with a track record in music to apply for funding to support the set up and delivery of collaborative songwriting sessions. Proposals should present a fully developed programme with clear deliverables that will eventually lead to release outcomes.

Proposals should be for camps and sessions to be held between 1 July 2023 and 31 December 2024.

A total pool of \$130,000 (plus GST) will be made available for distribution but Te Māngai Pāho reserves the right to distribute a higher or lesser amount.

Only companies and trusts may apply. Sole Traders (Individuals) are ineligible.
